### **Notes for teachers:**

### Suggested guidelines:

- 1. Introduce the topic by showing pupils the timeline and ask them to identify in which decade is today and when they were born. Teacher could suggest when they were born or ask pupils if they know when parents / grandparents were born.
- 2. Discuss vocabulary relating to other groupings of time days, years, decades, centuries, Millennia and ensure understanding.
- 3. Ask pupils to cut out the text boxes and work together to rearrange them in the correct order of decades going forward in time.
- 4. Teachers' versions have exact dates to assist with prompting if pupils need clues.
- 5. Ask pupils to rearrange them in the correct order of decades going backward in time.
- 6. Extension work pupils could research ...

- clothing worn
- architectural / town planning changes

- **Population** is 180,000.
- Thousands of Leeds men volunteer to join the British Forces, many recruited at football matches. Some took part in army drilling and shooting practice at Elland Road.
- Nearly every street in Leeds lost a man in the bloody Battle of Somme.
- 10 million army greatcoats and 30 million boots are made in Leeds.
- Leeds women go to work, including at the dangerous munitions factories. 35 Barnbow girls died in a Leeds factory explosion.
