Ask Tom Palmer

How did you become a writer?

I was reluctant to read before I reached 17, so being a writer was the last job on my list. But my mum used football newspapers and magazines to encourage me to enjoy reading. It worked! I started to really love stories, wanting to try my own. Reading made me a writer.



Where do you get your ideas and inspiration from?

First of all it comes from something I am interested in. (Like football or a war.) I can walk past an old football stadium or do something fun with my family that makes me think about a story. Then I try and find more out by reading about it and watching films and going to places to discover more. I always keep a notebook with me to write ideas down.

How do you start writing your stories, and how long do they take?

Longer books, like *Foul Play*, take four months to write. The *Football Academy* books take about a month each. I start by going to the places the book is set, make a plan, then I write a first draft. I spend a lot of time making changes to improve it.

Do you base your characters like Danny Harte in the Foul Play books on anyone in real life?

Sort of. Danny is what I wish I'd been when I was 14. But wasn't brave like he is. A lot of my villains are based on real people. You might be able to work out who. Basing characters on real people can be a good way to make characters more believable. In my historical fiction, I research real people's experiences through interviews and articles to make sure they are accurately and authentically represented.

What books do you enjoy reading?

Stories. Books about travelling to foreign countries. Crime fiction. Books about football abroad. I am open to reading anything - I am currently reading *Anne of Green Gables!*



What advice do you have for anyone who wants to be a writer?

1 Read books by lots of different authors so you can learn what you like and don't like.

2 Write about what you love or hate: then you will write with passion.

3 And never give up if you want to get published.

If I can do it, then why not you?

What do you do when you're not writing?

Spend time with my wife and daughter. Watch football and rugby. Read. And I like fell running.

Which football team do you support, and why?

Leeds. Because I always have. And I was born there.

Where is your favourite place to read or write?

Writing in the kitchen. Reading in bed.

1What's the most unusual fact about you and your life?

Probably that I met my wife in the Sahara Desert.
